About OUR COLLEGE

SJMV MAHANTHA FIRST GRADE ARTS and COMMERCE COLLEGE was started in 1986 by the renowned Karnataka Progressive Education Society (KPES) Dharwad. The KPES was founded by the noted, legal and literary luminary Dr. G.M.Patil, the leading practitioner of Law, in Dharwad.

In 1992 for better and fair administration the college was handed over to Shri Jagadguru Murugharajendra Vidyapeetha Brahanmath-Chitradurga, on the auspicious occasion of His Holiness Shri Mahant Swamiji's 80th Birth Day Celebration. The college has been renamed as SJMV's Mahantha I-Grade Arts & Commerce College in 2006.

From 1992 to 2002 the college was running in the serene & spiritual backdrop of Sri Murugha Math premises. The college came under Grant-in-Aid system from the Government of Karnataka. The College is affiliated to Karnatak University, Dharwad and has 2(f) and 12(b) from UGC, and Permanent Affiliation from KUD. It imparts higher education in two streams namely Arts and Commerce. It is one of the prestigious premier institutions of Sri Murugharajendra Vidvapeetha.

In the year 2002 the college was shifted to Adarsha Girl's High School Campus, Ramanagar, Dharwad. Even then the student's strength considerably increased year by year. It is a matter of pride and prestige to state that, the College

was shifted to the newly constructed building at Rayapur in the year 2010. Due to multi-range of choice of subject combinations, there is a wide scope for students to choose their dream subjects and this has helped to increase the strength of the college year by year.

Under the able and proper guidance and of the dynamic Principal Dr. Shanthaiah.K.S., our teachers have been making good attempts in teaching and research. The most dedicated, devoted, experienced, well-read and enthusiastic members of the teaching staff are striving hard to bring about all-round development of the students and try their best to instill confidence and competency in them. Because of the team spirit and efforts, the college was reaccredited by NAAC at Grade 'B' Level during 2015.

With an intention to impart value education to the present youth, the college conducts Vachana Kammata Examination every year. Vachana is a short sacred poem, which were written by poet-saints of 12th Century. Vachanas emit spiritual values and morality in the lives of people. To enable the students to study and inculcate those values, the President of our Vidyapeetha Dr. Sri Shivamurthy Murugharajendra Sharanaru is conducting Vachana Kammata exams in all degree colleges of Karnataka. Students of our college have been successfully attempting and secured state level ranks.

To develop academic, social and spiritual standards among the students, ample care and attention is taken by the institution. Curricular, extra-curricular and Skill based activities are undertaken from time to time in our institution.



ADMISSION CONDITIONS

Admission to B.A.Part-I and B.Com Part-I classes are made on the basis of merit. Each student has to produce original and true copy of each of the following documents at the time of admission.

- Marks card of PU Board of Equivalent Examination like JOC (Two Xerox copies)
- Character Certificate from the head of Institution last attended
- Students whose parental income is less than Rs. 44,500-00 are eligible for fee concession (Tuition fee of both I & II term will be excepted) They should enclose the income certificate issued by Tahashildar (Three Xerox copies) Income Certificate should be in Appendix No. 2 of Form No. 3.
- Students belonging to Schedule Castes and Schedule Tribe should bring the Caste Certificate issued by Tahasildar in Form D (Three Xerox copies)
- Students belonging to category I (B.T) should bring the caste certificate in Form E (Three Xerox copies)
- 6. Adhaar Card and Bank Pass Book (Xerox)

Note:

- All admissions are provisional and subject to the approval of Registrar, Karnatak University, Dharwad.
- b) The College reserves the right of admission.

- Each candidate will produce his/her six latest passport size photographs.
- d) Late admission will be subject to the permission of the Registrar, Karnatak University and availability of seats in the college.
- e) If any student desires to change the subject he/she may do so within a week from the last date of admission.
- f) FEES ONCE PAID WILL NOT BE REFUNDED UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.

TRANSFEER CERTIFICATE:

Students of other colleges seeking fresh admission in this college will apply for their transfer certificate (T.C) through the Principal of this college within a month from the last date of admission. Those who leave the college will have to apply for the transfer certificate through the Principal of the Institution newly joined.

MIGRATION CERTIFICATE:

Migration certificate in case of students coming from the University outside Karnatak State should be produced at the time of admission.

RULES FOR LEAVING THE COLLEGE:

- A Student who wishes to leave the college must apply in writing to the Principal and the application must be countersigned by his/her parents/guardian.
- No student will be permitted to leave the college until he/ she has cleared all his/her college dues (library dues and fee arrears).

A student has to pay the college fees and all other dues until his/her name is formally withdrawn.

ATTENDANCE

- Students are required to attend classes regularly and punctually.
- A Student who does not attend atleast 75% of the total classes held in each subject in each term is not allowed to take University Examination. (Under Semester Scheme, it is compulsory)

COLLEGE EXAMINATION RULES.

There will be two internal Examinations each semester. It is compulsory for each student to pass in them.

RULES FOR BEING ELIGIBLE TO TAKE UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION.

To be eligible to appear for the University Examination, a student must fulfil the following conditions.

- He/ She must have attended at least 75% of the classes held in each subject in each term.
- 2. He/ She must have attended the internal examinations
- He/ She must have cleared all the college dues and returned library books.
- 4. He/ She must not be guilty of gross misbehaviour

SCHOLARSHIP, FEE CONCESSIONS AND OTHER GRANTS

All those students whose family annual income is not more than Rs. 44,500/- are eligible for concession of tuition fees and examination fees awarded by the Government of Karnataka. Besides the above, the following scholarships and free ships of the Government are also available.

CENTRAL GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIPS.

- National Scholarships for the children of primary and secondary school teachers.
- National Merit Scholarship: Only those who are awarded this scholarship while studying in PUC II are eligible to avail themselves of this scholarship.
- Scholarship in post metric studies in English and Hindi to students from Non-Hindi speaking states.
- Government of India post metric scholarship to SC/ST students.

STATE GOVERNMENT SCHOLARSHIP.

- Educational Concessions to the children and dependents of service personnel in the Army / Navy / Air Force.
- Scholarship to the physically handicapped students (Those who have passed their previous examination in first attempt with 40% marks)
- Backward class post metric Scholarship to the students whose parental income is less than Rs. 44,500/- per annum.
- The college also awards scholarship from the Student's Aid Fund to poor and meritorious students who are not covered by the above scholarships and freeships. (Subject to the approval of the Management)
- 5. Vidya Poshak Scholarship
- Cash Prize Scholarship: Cash prize are awarded to students scoring cent percent marks in subjects and Scoring 90 percent marks in education.

Note:

- The Scholarship amount will be paid as per the Govt. Instructions within a week of the receipt of the Scholarship to the scholar in person by cheques. It will lapse if not claimed in time.
- While receiving the scholarship amount the scholar, if he/ she desires, may see the sanction order of the scholarships by the issuing authority.
- The award of the above scholarships is subject to good behaviour, attendance and satisfactory progress. If these conditions are not satisfied by the scholar, the amount will be refunded to the Govt.

IMPORTANT

- 1. Fees once paid will not be refunded.
- 2. Part payment is not permitted
- All dues must be cleared before the applications for the University Examination are sent.
- Fees shall be paid for the full term even if one studies for a part there of.
- Students should show their identity card while entering the campus

LIBRARY

The Library is well-equipped with Text books, Reference books, General books, Encyclopaedias subject journals and Periodicals. (E-Journals Accellability)

EVALUATION

The students are assessed regularly through internal two tests through each semester. Attending the tests and Examination are compulsory.

TRAVEL CONCESSIONS

The following travel concessions are available to the

- KSRTC Student's Monthly Concession Pass: This is issued as per KSRTC rules to the bonafide students of the college who desire to travel by bus.
- Railway Concession: The concession is available to confide students of the college to travel from the college to the native place of student / examination centre / training centre and back, only during vacation. To apply for Railway concession, form can be had from the college office.

CULTURAL ASSOCIATIONS:

In order to explore the hidden talent amount the students and to help them to develop their personality the following cultural and literary associations, besides Gymkhana are formed.

- 2. Planning Forum 5. Sports Association
- 3. Debating Union 6. Cultural Association

Each of these associations will have a student secretary. The secretary will be nominated on the basis of merit.

Besides the inaugural and validictory function of all the cultural associations clubbed together, each association will periodically arrange one function of its own. The secretaries and Jt. secretaries for various associations are selected on the basis of merit. There will be no student election of any kind.

RULES OF DISCIPLINE.

 Smoking, chewing of pan, Gutkha and spitting and playing of transistors, mobile phones in and around the college

- premises are strictly prohibited. The students found guilty of such acts will be heavily punished including expulsion from the college.
- Loitering in the varandahs and corridors of the college is not allowed.
- During their leisure hours students should study in the reading room.
- Loitering outside while the classes are going on will be severely punished.
- Bicycle, scooters, motorcycles and mopeds should be parked only in the space provided for them.
- The students should read the notices that are displayed on the notic board every day and should know the information and instructions from time to time.
- Students will take proper care of the college furniture and keep the premises clean. Those who spoil or cause any damage or temper with college property, furniture fittings, plants etc., shall be severely punished.
- Students should maintain perfect silence in the classrooms.
 Students shall not stand outside the class rooms and must be within the class rooms before the teacher enters.
- Students must maintain perfect decorum and discipline at the college functions.
- Students must be punctual to their classes. Late comers will not be allowed.
- Students must show due respect to the members of teaching and non-teaching staff. Any misbehaviour will entail proper disciplinary action.

- 12. Without the prior permission of the Principal, no association can be formed and no pamphlet will be exhibited on the notice board. Private or Political pamphlets will not be exhibited on the notice boards.
- Insubordination, unbecoming language, ungentle-manly conduct, quarrelling etc., will be severely dealt with.
- Picnics are not allowed without the prior permission from the Principal.
- 15. Any violation of the above mentioned rules may result in penalty or the severance of membership of college, association, or loss of concessions or even expulsion from the college.

NSS

The college has been organising the activities on National Service Scheme, since 1992. The number of seats allotted by Karnatak University is 150. The aim of the NSS is to utilise the service of the students in promotion of the welfare of the poor and neglected areas. A student enrolled in NSS is expected to put in at least 120 hours of social service in an academic year including a ten day special camp. A student will be entitled to get a certificate from the University/college on completion of two years term i.e. 240 hours. A special camp will be conducted during the mid term vacation. Regular NSS activities will be held on Sundays and other holidays.

MAGAZINE

The college brings out every year a magazine called "Spoorthi". The copies of the magazine are distributed to all the students normally at the time of issue of marks cards.

The magazine aims at giving an opportunity to the students for self expression

'Mahanthavani' practice Journal wall paper published on special occasions is also meant for encouraging creativity in the students.

EMPLOYMENT INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE BUREAU AND GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL
